


The Great Thanksgiving

The Celebrant continues

We give thanks to you, O God, for the goodness and love which you have made known to us in creation; in the calling of Israel to be your people; in your Word spoken through the prophets; and above all in the Word made flesh, Jesus, your Son. For in these last days you sent him to be incarnate from the Virgin Mary, to be the Savior and Redeemer of the world. In him, you have delivered us from evil, and made us worthy to stand before you. In him, you have brought us out of error into truth, out of sin into right-eousness, out of death into life.

On the night before he died for us, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Therefore, according to his command, O Father,

We await his coming in glory.


The Celebrant continues

And we offer our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving to you, O Lord of all; presenting to you, from your creation, this bread and this wine.



By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever. **Amen.**





MUSIC NOTES—"Ubi Caritas" is a hymn of the Roman Catholic liturgy long used as one of the antiphons for the washing of feet on Maundy Thursday. They hymn is now used also in Lutheran and Anglican liturgies focusing on love and service to others. The original Gregorian Chant was used by 20th century French composer Maurice Durufle for his setting that is the most widely sung choral setting of the hymn. Today's prelude is a piano reduction of the Durufle "Ubi Caritas." The offertory anthem setting was composed by American Audrey Snyder, recognized as a top educational choral composer in the United States.—*Karen Harmon, Music Director*
